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# Principal's Message

Over the past four years, one of my favorite things to do as a principal (among many other things) is to welcome our students back in the fall, bring them into the gym as one huge class, and give them their challenge for the year, which is dependent on their grade level. Grade 10s typically come in, reserved, shy, and even a bit intimidated. Grade 11s enter with a “I’m-the-middle-child-so-no-one-will-notice-me” kind of an attitude until they are reminded of just how important a year grade 11 is. And then we have the grade 12s. Typically, grade 12s carry with them a mixture of excitement, to finally be so close to being done, and trepidation of what the future beyond high school holds for them. This year was different. While it was not possible to gather each grade level together, we brought them in as dyad groups. They were smaller, more intimate meetings, and I quickly found myself speaking more personally and even more emotionally than I had in years past. I shared with them a story about my husband who is a paramedic and firefighter with the City of Lethbridge.

When “this” all hit (the pandemic, that is), we know that frontline workers did not get “shut down” and their doors were not closed. Instead, they carried on. Sure, every day and even throughout the course of a day, procedures and protocols would shift, new gear had to be donned, and adaptations had to be made with patients and on calls. But they did it. They used creativity, common sense, and became flexible when faced with a new challenge. Six months later, things are still changing but they have learned to change with their current reality. You see, WE (both staff and the student body) did not get the same chance. We did not get the chance to prove ourselves. To adapt. To adjust. To show that we, too, could be creative, use common sense, and be flexible. Instead, the decision to close schools prohibited us from taking our current reality, looking it in the face, and saying, “We can handle you. We, too, will persevere.”


So, here we are. Six months later and the chance to prove ourselves. I have no doubt that if we remind ourselves of our calls to action for year two of our faith plan - to be grateful and to be gracious - and we work together to focus on the safety of our school community, each other, and ourselves, we will persevere. For “[w]hen [we] are grateful, fear disappears and abundance appears” (T. Robbins).

And with that, on behalf of the staff at Catholic Central, we would like to welcome you on this incredible journey with us as we start another, yet very unique, school year!



# Meet our 2020-21 PS 3 Interns





## Work Experience

Work Experience is a program designed to create an opportunity for students to earn high school credits and experience the World of Work first hand. Students may be in a paid or a volunteer position. Students can earn up to 15 credits towards their High School Diploma. All students must have complete the HCS 3000 (Workplace Safety Systems) course before starting work experience and complete the *Off-Campus Work Agreement* form and return it **BEFORE** hours of work will start to be accumulated. Students are responsible for finding their own positions.

## Green Certificate Program

This program is a joint endeavor between Alberta Education and Alberta Agriculture and Forestry. Participants learn by actively performing the skills required under the direction of experienced farm personal and provides students with credentials that could lead to a career in agribusiness. Students must complete AGR3000 (an Agriculture Safety course). Students can earn up to 16 credits towards their High School Diploma . There are 14 different specializations to choose from. ## Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP)

This program provides senior high school students the opportunity to earn credits in high school and gain on-the-job training that can be applied towards an apprenticeship. Students can earn up to 40 credits towards their High School Diploma. All students must have complete the HCS 3000 (Workplace Safety Systems) course before starting RAP and be paid at least minimum wage for their work. RAP students will also receive their Apprenticeship Blue Book.




### Faith & Family

## NOTICE TO PARENT OR GUARDIAN OF RELIGIOUS PERMEATION

The *Alberta Human Rights Act* requires a school board to give notice to a parent or guardian when courses of study, education programs, institutional materials, instruction or exercises include subject matter that deals primarily and explicitly with religion. Every course of study and educational program, all institutional materials, instruction and exercises will at all times include subject matter that deals primarily and explicitly with religion.



## FAIR NOTICE LETTER

Dear Parents / Guardians,

The Holy Spirit Catholic School Division is committed to providing safe learning environments for all students, staff, school visitors and community members. When a student behaves inappropriately, principals use progressive discipline to help a student take responsibility for their actions, change their behavior and learn from their mistakes.

When students' behaviors pose a potential threat to safety or serious harm, the Southwest Alberta Regional Violence Risk Threat Assessment Protocol (VTRA) helps principals take further steps to protect students' well-being. The protocol helps schools respond quickly to threatening incidents such as: possession of a weapon or a replica weapon, bomb threats or plans, verbal, written or electronic (internet, text) threats to kill or injure oneself or others or other threats of violence, fire setting.

The Southwest Alberta Regional VTRA Protocol outlines how a school responds immediately to threatening behavior. Principals may first bring together a School Threat Assessment Team, which ideally includes the principal / associate principal, a school based counsellor / jurisdictional lead and police. If the situation is serious the principal may also consult the Superintendent of Schools and call in members of the Community Threat Assessment Team. This community team may include representatives of community agencies who work with us to keep our schools safer such as, but not limited to, local police, children's mental health organizations or Child and Family Services. Parents / guardians will be notified as soon as possible in the Stage I - VTRA Process. If parents / guardians cannot be reached, but a concern for safety still exists due to threatening behavior, the threat assessment may still proceed. Personal information shared throughout this process will respect and balance each individual's right to privacy with the need to ensure the safety of all.

This letter complies with procedure 2 of *Administrative Procedure 322: Violence Threat / Risk Assessment (V-TRA) Protocol*, which states that parents / guardians will be provided with "fair notice" that each threat will be taken seriously.
