A little over a week ago, I had the absolute honor of being part of a Naming Ceremony for our school. This ceremony all came to be when Ms. Emily Fox, our First Nations, Metis, and Inuit Support Worker approached me with the desire to update our current signage, treaty information, and land acknowledgment in the front entrance of the school. With the guidance of Division Principal, Mrs. Annette Bruised Head, it was quickly realized that our school name did not "translate well." And so began the story of Catholic Central's Naming Ceremony. Both Ms. Fox and Mrs. Bruised Head reached out to Kainai Elder, Tom Little Bear, who felt equally honored in selecting an appropriate name; we are grateful for all three of you. Many thanks to Board Trustee, Danny Ponjavic and Superintendent Ken Samspon for attending and, especially, the staff and students of CCH who are very much the reason we were bestowed this name. Catholic Central High School Honoured with Blackfoot Name - Taatsikioyis

On Wednesday, October 28, 2020, a small group met in the Catholic Central High School Theatre to partake in a smudge, face painting, and special naming ceremony for the entire school by Kainai Elder, Tom Little Bear (*Kaataomaahka* - No Runner)

Mr. Little Bear began by speaking about the cultural significance of the number "four," and how appropriate it is that Catholic Central High School should be the fourth institution in the City of Lethbridge to receive a name.

He went on to talk about his youth, explaining how fortunate he was to have a strong traditional Blackfoot upbringing, where his grandparents were leaders in the sacred community. Alongside his education at home, he experienced an education rooted in the Catholic faith having been a student of Ecole St. Mary, St. Francis Junior High School, and Catholic Central High School. Models of prayer were everywhere for him - in the morning seeing his grandmother greet Creator and creation, in the evening when his grandfather conducted smudges, and through the kindness and guidance of his teachers at school, some of whom were Sisters of the Faithful Companions of Jesus (FCJ).



Woven into the story of his youth, Elder Little Bear spoke about the annual Sundance held on the Kainai reserve. This significant cultural event brings the Kainai people together to refresh themselves and reinforce their spiritual and traditional ties to the land, the Creator, and each other. He explained that, though many tipis gather at Sundance, it is always centre tipi that is considered to be the most sacred.

And, from this tale, he bestowed Catholic Central High School with its new name:

Taatsikioyis - "Centre Tipi"

The sacred centre of one of the most important events in the Kainai tradition.



Those present were visibly moved.

Principal Joanne Polec remarked that, when she heard the name, "It truly felt like we were on holy ground, a most sacred space. Words cannot express how blessed I feel to have had the opportunity to be present in this moment of reconciliation today. Together with the administrative team, with the continued leadership of our Division First Nations, Metis, and Inuit Principal, Annette Bruised Head, and with the guidance and collaborative support

from our elders and First Nations Workers, I have no doubt that we will endeavor to live up to the name we have been given."

"I felt so privileged to have been a part of this powerful and beautifully moving ceremony; listening to Elder Tom Little Bear's wisdom about the interconnectedness of our faith and the cultural beliefs and ways of being of our Blackfoot people," said Superintendent Ken Sampson. "As a Catholic school division, we continue to be truly blessed by the presence and leadership of the First Nations people of our communities."

"Many of our Blackfoot Community know the significance of the name and the honor to have received it is incredible," expressed Annette Bruised Head, Division Principal of First Nations, Metis and Inuit Education. "In my experience of the *Taatsikioyis*, it is a place of sacredness, learning and relationship. It is where the Blackfoot gather each summer to renew our relationship with all creation and Creator. Now our school is the place where the spirit of that sacred renewal is lived out. Our Blackfoot students can be connected even further and come to fully realize the significance of learning and prayer, in the way that their parents, grandparents, and relatives who have attended our Holy Spirit Catholic Schools; and to fulfill the wishes of those that went before them...get an education, pray, and have courage."



Catholic Central High School's new Blackfoot name will be prominently displayed in the school's front foyer, reminding all who enter that they are in a sacred place.

End of Quarter 1 - Beginning of Quarter 2

As we transition from quarter 1 and into quarter 2, please take note of these important dates:

Last day of quarter 1 classes is Tuesday, November 3. Many teachers are running their in-class finals on Monday and Tuesday next week. So as to allow students every opportunity to succeed and write these finals in a non-distracting environment, we are allowing teachers the freedom to dismiss students upon completion of an exam and/or approval from the teacher. Teachers have been asked to advise parents/ guardians of this (if applicable to their context). Should this apply to your child, please reinforce that upon dismissal, he/she will need to leave the school and head directly home. There is to be no gathering or lingering both within and outside of the school, nor should there be gatherings anywhere else.

• Grade 12 students who are choosing to write their diploma exams should know when and where they will be writing. If you (your child) is unsure, please reach out to your child's teacher(s).

• November 9 and 10 have been declared Division Wellness Days. These are non-operational school days for both staff and students, with the exception of those students who are choosing to write Physics 30 and/or Biology 30 diploma exams.

• November 11 is Remembrance Day and the school will be closed.

• At-home Learner drop-off /pickup of materials will be conducted on November 12 and 13. Students will drop off any quarter 1 materials and collect quarter 2 materials at the same time:

- November 12 AM Grade 12
- November 12 PM Grade 11
- November 13 AM Grade 10
- Olasses for AHL sections will begin on November 16.
- Trinity learners will follow the same idea as above (drop-off/ pickup) using the following schedule:
 - ♦ November 16 AM Grade 12
 - ♦ November 16 PM Grade 11
 - ◊ November 17 AM Grade 10
 - Students attending Trinity face-to-face will begin on November 17.


