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Principal's Message

The staff and students at Catholic Central are extremely excited to announce that the history and legacy that is Santa's Anonymous will continue this year! In fact, our cohorted classes have already



been busy collecting items that are required for each carefully prepared hamper. This year's version of the Santa's Anonymous Project has been appropriately named the "Blitz(en) Edition" as it will be a short blitz of activity, which will run over five weeks and will endeavor to support a third of the families from the total number of families supported in year's past. Last year, Santa's Anonymous delivered hampers to 97 families. This year, Santa's Anonymous will have hampers ready for pick up from schools within the Holy Spirit School Division for around 30 families. While the pandemic has forced us to think differently about how we can still ensure that this good and important work is done in a scaled down version, it cannot not keep us from doing what is needed to spread kindness, especially during this time of year. We must remember that for most Christmas might be a time of joy, of blessings, of hope, and of celebration but, for some, it can be a time of stress - emotionally, physically, and financially - on others...and even more so in 2020.

Although it has become even more challenging to fulfil our goal, given the most recent announcement of transition to at-home learning for all students, we would like to thank you all for doing what you could to support the collection of hamper items. Should you have any other items you would like to donate, please contact us at the school (403-327-4596) and we would be happy to arrange a drop off time as both campuses will remain open during operational hours of the school day. If donations of hamper items are not feasible at this time, we ask that you continue to pray for our students and their families. This has already proven to be a challenging year but I continue to believe that our school community will continue to support and care for each other through even the most difficult of times.

It is moments like this that I am truly humbled by the big, giving hearts of our CCH community. Thank you. Santa's Anonymous Blitzen Edition

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Hello!

You may be curious about what is happening this year for Santa's Anonymous. We have had to approach things differently this year and would like to let you know what we have been doing for the last couple of weeks, if you don't already know. Based on the great buy-in that we saw with Quarter 1 religion classes and their culminating projects, we decided to get the whole school involved in Santa's both to build community as well as to reflect the idea that all of our little actions contribute to a large impact.

We are calling this year's version Santa's Anonymous: Blitzen Edition, because the concept was to blitz collection of items that the hampers require. The challenge was for each cohort to build a hamper, by encouraging students to bring in the items required during that week. The Religion department graciously offered to assist with some of the coordination. collection, sorting and tracking of the items. We will be constructing the hampers just prior to the Advent Mass held on December 16th, have them blessed, and then distribute them via our colleagues in other Holy Spirit schools.

Student Surveys

What is the purpose of a survey?

Surveys provide a snapshot of attitudes and behaviours - including thoughts, opinions, and comments - about the target population/ group. Survey results provide valuable feedback and can provide a baseline to measure and establish a benchmark from which to compare results over time.

What are the types of surveys administered to students at CCH?

- Two snapshots (one before Christmas and one around Easter) using The Learning Bar's OurSchool Survey. The survey is focused on measuring the factors that have been proven to directly affect students' academic achievement, health and well-being, engagement and attainment.
- The February administration of Alberta Education's Accountability Pillar. This survey goes out to teachers, parents, and students. The data in the Accountability Pillar gives a good idea of school and school authority performance, including successes and potential challenges. Schools and school authorities use the data to find ways to improve student learning and achievement.
- Any other educational research studies that we are approved to engage in, in order to support our educational partners like the University of Lethbridge.

Educational Research Study

Currently, permission has been granted to support a 15-minute research study that may be done on smartphones or tablets. The survey is completely optional for high school students and completely anonymous. By following the link to the survey, a student has provided consent (if he/she is 18 or over) or assent (if he/she is under 18) to participate in this study. If a student changes his/her mind about participating in this study, he/she can stop completing it and close the browser. 

Twenty-eight daily readings for the Advent season are followed by materials for the twelve days of Christmas which follow.




A Christmas Secret by Anne Perry. Ballantine Books, 2006. 198 p.

A reaction to how consumerism has stolen the soul of Christmas, this book helps us understand how to make Christmas what it should be--a joyous celebration of Jesus' birth that enriches our hearts and the world around us.



Merry Christmas, Alex Cross by James Patterson. Little, Brown, 2012. 323 p.

Alex Cross and his family are celebrating Christmas Eve when a father takes his ex-wife and children hostage, but soon a second situation explodes that puts millions at risk and Alex is forced to make a decision that may end as many lives as it saves.



The Christmas Thief by Mary Higgins Clark. Pocket Books, 2004. 298 p.

The decision to choose an eight-foot blue spruce from Vermont to be Rockefeller Center's famous Christmas tree causes difficulties for Packy Noonan, a scam artist released from prison as he hid stolen diamonds in the tree.



A Christmas Homecoming by Anne Perry. Ballantine Books, 2011. 212 p.

A Victorian mystery with Charlotte and Thomas Pitt who travel to a Yorkshire fishing village to watch a Christmas theatrical presentation but are faced with tempers, wind and snow, and ultimately a murder.



An Amish Christmas by Cynthia Keller. Ballantine Books, 2008. 239 p.




