

event is for students from grades 7-12 in Alberta; high school students have the opportunity to **earn credits** with support from their home school. Teachers and Support Staff may register multiple students at the same time.

The staff at Catholic Central are committed to ensuring that there will be a celebratory culminating exercise for our Graduating Class of 2021.

We recognize the importance of providing our graduates with a graduation ceremony to:

- acknowledge 13 years of commitment to their academic journey from K-12
- provide closure to the school year and a means to celebrate their individual accomplishments
- honor this milestone in their lives and bless them as they continue beyond our school community

While we cannot commit to any ONE scenario, we can outline our options at this point. However, please note that our options will be impacted by whichever government public health measures are in place at the time of planning/ decision -making. It is important to note that much of the work and planning for grad is typically front-loaded and, as such, there are certain dates in place for us to make decisions by. We will continue to monitor the government public health measures and remain as flexible as possible throughout the process.



Grad Option A: Grad in its "traditional" form on Friday, May 14 and Saturday, May 15, 2021 at The Enmax Centre - this is pretty much "back-to-normal" option. For this option to be "a go," we will need to decide by Friday, February 26th. This decision will be heavily dependent on the public health measures in place at the time.

No restrictions on indoor gatherings in any setting	•	Mass, convocation, and grand march all at the Enmax with adherence to maximum capacity of Enmax. As the deadline to commit to banquet providers and online ticket vendors has passed and the logistics of serving "pre/ individually-packaged food in a "drive-thru" method is not feasible, we will NOT be offering a graduation banquet this year.
No restrictions on outdoor gatherings in any setting		Mass, convocation, and grand march at the Enmax with no limit on guests.
No mandatory masks for indoor or outdoor gatherings		Masks would be optional.
No consideration of physical distancing required		In our planning, there would be no need to socially distance students, staff, families, guests.
Other important information		Please note that in speaking with the Enmax, there are absolutely no alternative dates available for the rest of May or for all of June. They are completely booked with, potentially, delayed concerts, sporting events, etc. So, the "original" weekend would be what we would have to proceed with.

GRAD OPTION B: A "Drive-In" Graduation option in an outdoor setting on Saturday, June 12, 2021 at the Exhibition Grounds (South Pavilion/ parking lot)

Restriction on outdoor gatherings of anywhere between 10-100 or more	 We have tentatively booked the South Pavilion/ parking lot at the Exhibition Grounds Students would get the opportunity to celebrate their accomplishments with a "walk across the stage" to receive their convocation box from CCH administration. Each grad would be invited to attend the event with one vehicle with family members (natural cohort). Only the grad would be allowed out of his/her vehicle. FM radio would be used for guests to listen to the event. This event would also be livestreamed for those who could not attend.
No indoor gatherings or very limited numbers	 A virtual prayer service and convocation slideshow would be made available for graduates.
Mandatory masks for indoor or outdoor gatherings	Masks would be mandatory.
Heavy adherence to physical distancing required	Physical distancing measures would be applied.

GRAD OPTION C: This is the scenario most akin to what the directives for Albertans are to date. This would be a full lockdown with limited services.

No outdoor or indoor gatherings of any kind	 A virtual prayer service and convocation slideshow would be made available for graduates. Grad boxes with certificates, caps, tassels, eagle feathers (for First Nations graduates), Metis sashes (for Metis graduates), and other items related to graduation would be made ready for pick up.
Date	• We would endeavor to have all events offered in a virtual platform by June 30th, 2021.

Important information and dates moving forward:

Grad Requirements: in order to qualify for graduation, a student must

•have attained or be in position to attain 90 credits by the end of quarter 3,

•have completed Religious Education 35 by the end of quarter 3, and

•have attained or be in position to attain 100 credits by the end of quarter 4, or

•be in a special program (ie: Certificate of High School Completion vs. High School Diploma)

Grad Requirements: Administration and guidance counsellors are busy working on the creation of a grad list. This list indicates who is eligible to participate in the graduation ceremonies. There are three categories that a student might fall into:

- 1. Has met all grad requirements (as outlined above) and therefore may opt to participate in graduation ceremonies.
- 2. 2. May be eligible should all requirements (as outlined above). These students will be issued a "maybe" letter, which outlines the expectations required prior to any decision on graduation eligibility has been made.
- 3. 3. Is not eligible to participate. These students will be contacted directly to work through a plan to graduate in the following year.

- **Grad Parent Meeting**: will be held virtually sometime in early February. Once the details have been worked out, we will share the information with our parents/ guardians/ graduates.
- **Grad Hoodies**: will go on sale through SchoolCash Online on February 1st February 19th. More information to come.
- **Grad Photos**: Booking for grad photo sittings will open on January 4th, 2021 through LifeTouch, through their website: <u>https://lifetouch.ca/</u> Once the site is active, students can go in and select their location (Lethbridge, Catholic Central High School) and select a day and time to book. If none of the dates or times listed work, please call LifeTouch directly at (403) 327-2658 to arrange an alternate day and time. All photos will be taken at the LifeTouch studio in Lethbridge.

There is NO CHARGE to grads to have their picture taken. Pictures are taken on these dates and times:

 $_{\odot}$ February 16-19th - these dates/ times will be the first to open for bookings

 $_{\odot}$ March 1-5th - these dates/ times will be back-up/ alternate dates should the week of February 16-19th not work

Grad Fees: Fees will run anywhere between \$50-\$150 depending on which option we will proceed with. Once we are able to decide on the option, we will set fees. Fees can be paid through School Cash Online, which can be accessed from our homepage: https://holyspirit.schoolcashonline.com/ Grad fees must be paid in full in order to participate in graduation events.


