- It is not just all about "core courses". Yes, the cores (Religious Education, Social, Sciences, English, Math) are significant, but there is so much more to consider. Remember, a minimum of 10 Career and Technology Studies credits are required to graduate (along with others). Our staff is among the best you will find at providing unique non-core courses that are designed to engage your student and provide learning opportunities to foster their passion for learning and develop key areas of interest in their educational journey
- Feel free to contact the school and ask to speak with an administrator or counsellor if you have questions or inquiries in regards to how to best plan your student's journey toward becoming a high school graduate. We have many years of experience and are happy to help you!



Transitioning from Junior High to CCH

Dear Parents/Guardians of Grade 9 Students:

Your son/daughter will soon be embarking on the next exciting stage in his/her educational journey. We are looking forward to welcoming these new students to Catholic Central High School (CCHS), and being part of their academic, spiritual, and social growth. To help ease the transition from junior high to high school, and to ensure that you have all the information necessary to assist your child in making decisions, we invite you to view our parent information video that will be accessible on our school website https://cch.holyspirit.ab.ca/ by the first week of February and for the rest of the course selection period (until March 5th). Please view the information video and take notes of any questions you might have. Should you still require further clarification, we will have a Google Form for you to fill out wherein we can gather common questions and proceed with a) creating Q&A documents; b) hosting a virtual platform (like a Google Meet or Zoom) to answer your questions; or c) scheduling a 1:1 appointment with you and your child, should that be required.

In the video, we will provide information about program selection and registration. Students are also welcome (and encouraged) to watch, although they will be receiving similar information during classroom Google Meets with Catholic Central administration. On February 10, 2021, CCHS administration will be meeting virtually, with your child with your child's classroom teacher present to facilitate the process. St. Francis classes will complete course selections from 8:30-10:00 a.m. and FLVT, St. Catherines, and St. Joes will complete course selections from 1:30-3:00 p.m. Students will have program handbooks and a copy of their course selection sheets to bring home to you for approval. Please have all course selection sheets submitted back to your child's school no later than Thursday, March 4, 2021.

In terms of how to register your child to attend CCHS, current Holy Spirit students will be completing a registration update ("re-registration") form online. Students from our feeder schools (of which your child's current school is one) will need to indicate the designated school as CCHS. The division is targeting February 1st for these registration update forms to roll out to you via email. Any students new to the division will need to wait until after February 22nd to register. Please note that course selections for CCHS cannot be completed until the registration update form has been submitted online.

While we hope that the video, various ways of answering questions you might have, and the facilitated course selection sessions with your child should provide you and your child with the information you need to transition to high school, we recognize that this can be daunting. We are here to support and guide you through this in any way we can.

At CCHS, we believe that a culture of Rigor, Relevance and Relationships is essential to ensuring the success of all students. We look forward to welcoming you and your child into our community.

The **High School Finance Competition** is an annual finance-focused competition presented by the Dhillon School of Business at the University of Lethbridge. It is open to Canadian high school students in grades 9, 10, 11, and 12. Represent your high school while competing in a team of 3-4.

Competition Details

Each team that registers will receive an information package explaining the competition in detail, software to download and will be invited to an online training session with an event organizer. In addition, each team is allowed one teacher advisor they may consult with throughout the competition. The competition will include an Investment Challenge, Investment Challenge Presentation, and Trading Challenge.

This year the Trading Challenge practice servers will be available once the Investment Challenge starts. This will allow everyone ample time to practice before the day of live competing. **You will be required to download and install client software to access the Trading Challenge. (**PC only**) More details will be made available on the competition webpage, https://www.uleth.ca/dhillon/high-school-accounting-finance-competition once the registration closes.


