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Principal's Message

The Principal's Message for March is being brought to you by acting Associate Principal, Mrs. Schmidt. Enjoy this reflection on the Lenten Season.

This year our season of Lent began while we were on our February break. So, what exactly is Lent? Many of us were raised to "give something up" for Lent such as candy, watching tv, time on the computer, etc. But, what if Lent could be something different?

Henri Nouwen was a Dutch Catholic priest, professor, writer and theologian. At the time of his passing in 1996, he lived at L'Arche Daybreak in Richmond Hill, Ontario. Nouwen's teachings and interests included psychology, pastoral ministry, spirituality, social justice and community. In his book *The Return of the Prodigal Son: A Story of Homecoming* (New York: Image Books, 1992), Nouwen says the following about Lent.


"For most of my life I have struggled to find God, to know God, to love God. I have tried hard to follow the guidelines of the spiritual life—pray always, work for others, read the Scriptures—and to avoid the many temptations to dissipate myself. I have failed many times but always tried again, even when I was close to despair.



Now I wonder whether I have sufficiently realized that during all this time God has been trying to find me, to know me, and to love me. The question is not "How am I to find God?" but "How am I to let myself be found by him?" The question is not "How am I to know God?" but "How am I to let myself be known by God?" And, finally, the question is not "How am I to love God?" but "How am I to let myself be loved by God?" God is looking into the distance for me, trying to find me, and longing to bring me home."

We are coming up to the one-year anniversary of our schools being shut down last year in Alberta due to this pandemic. Life is still not the same as what we remember it nor has it come back to what we wish it to be. However, when we look at Nouwen's words, we find strength in what he tells us. "God is looking into the distance for me...". What encouraging words during these trying times.

At Catholic Central we see so many instances of everyone around us "looking into the distance for us". Our Student Council has provided some nice early morning treats and has managed to plan a few school spirit activities among our restrictions. Our Yearbook Staff has been asking the students to send in photos relating to this year's yearbook theme showing how we are keeping our spirits up while being apart. Our student body was able to make a fairly quick pivot to online learning for the four weeks that were mandated in December and January. The students have not lost their positive attitudes when coming to school. Our staff has been


recognizes excellence in teachers beginning their professional careers.







CATHOLIC CENTRAL GRADUATION 2021

As promised, it is Friday, February 26th, which is the deadline that was originally set for a decision about how Grad 2021 will look like. After many conversations with all of our community providers, other high school administrative teams, CCH staff, and central office, we have decided that Catholic Central "Grad Option B," which is a Drive-In Graduation will be the format for our ceremonies.

We have gratefully partnered with the Enmax and Feature Productions to present this live, drive-in event in order to celebrate and acknowledge the culmination of a 13 year journey for our graduates on Saturday, June 12, 2021! So SAVE-THE DATE!

Here are the details for the Drive-In Graduation 2021:

Restriction on outdoor gatherings of anywhere between 10-100 or more

- We have booked the Enmax parking lot for Saturday, June 12, 2021.
- Depending on the number per outdoor gatherings at the time, we plan to have shorter rotating ceremonies wherein a formal Convocation would occur. For example: if the number per outdoor gathering is 50, we would have a group of 46 graduates sit (physically distanced) to hear various addresses before coming up to accept their diploma and have their tassels turned. Each group would then culminate the ceremony with a hat toss.
- Graduates would get the opportunity to celebrate their accomplishments with a "walk across the stage," while their graduation statement is read to receive their convocation box from CCH administration and have their tassels turned.
- Each graduate would be invited to attend the event with two vehicles (we would have to determine the number of vehicles based on the size of the number of graduates) with family members (natural cohort). Only the graduate would be allowed out of his/her vehicle.
- FM radio would be used for guests to listen to the event.
- This event would also be livestreamed for those who could not attend.
- Graduates would then have the opportunity to purchase a USB recording for the entire event (which would include ALL of the ceremonies for each gathering).

No indoor gatherings or very limited numbers	It is our every intent that a mass or service be a part of our celebrations.
	As such, we are currently in conversation with our faith leaders/ parishes in terms of a graduation mass or service and what that might look like.
	An Opening and Closing Prayer, as well as an Invocation for Graduates will be included in our Convocation Ceremonies.
	A Graduation Banquet would not be part of our ceremonies as restrictions do not allow for this to occur.
Mandatory masks for indoor or outdoor gatherings	Masks would be mandatory.
Heavy adherence to physical distancing required	Physical distancing measures would be applied.

Other details:

- Grad Requirements: in order to qualify for graduation, a student must
 - have attained or be in position to attain 90 credits by the end of quarter 3,
 - have completed Religious Education 35 by the end of quarter 3, and
 - have attained or be in position to attain 100 credits by the end of quarter 4, or
 - be in a special program (ie:Certificate of High School Completion vs. High School Diploma)
- **Grad List**: Administration and guidance counsellors are working on finalizing a grad list. This list indicates who is eligible to participate in the graduation ceremonies. There are three categories that a student might fall into: 1. Has met all grad requirements (as outlined above) and therefore may opt to participate in graduation ceremonies. 2. May be eligible should all requirements (as outlined above). These students will be issued a "maybe" letter, which outlines the expectations required prior to any decision on graduation eligibility has been made. 3. Is not eligible to participate. These students will be contacted directly to work through a plan to graduate in the following year. If you or your student is unsure of his/her graduation status, please contact Mrs. Hoveling at hovelingi@holyspirit.ab.ca
- **Grad Parent Meeting**: a date is yet to be determined once we have worked out the logistics/ details with our providers/ vendors, we will endeavor to host a grad parent meeting. In the meantime, if you have any questions related to graduation, please direct them to Mrs. Polec poleci@holvspirit.ab.ca although she prefers a phone call over an email!

- **Grad Statements:** As each graduate processes across the stage, a statement (that has been written by the graduate) is read. A Google form has been created and posted in the Grad 2021 Google Classroom for each graduate to complete and submit. The deadline for submission is **Friday, May 28th, 2021**. If your child requires any assistance in completing his/her statement, please contact Mr. Vercillo at vercilloa@holyspirit.ab.ca
- **Grad Photos**: These grad photos should have been booked by now. If they have not, please book online as soon as possible. If there are no sittings available, please contact Mrs. Noyes by email (noyess@holyspirit.ab.ca) or call the school. All photos will be taken at the LifeTouch studio in Lethbridge. There is NO CHARGE to grads to have their picture taken and we encourage all graduates to have one taken for the large composite. Please note, while Catholic Central has partnered with LifeTouch for graduation photos, we do not establish the protocols for how the studios conduct these sittings.
- Grad Fees: Fees will run around \$50 depending on costs incurred (ie: cost of Feature Productions, printing costs, convocation box and items including cap and tassel, etc.). Fees can be paid through School Cash Online, which can be accessed from our homepage: https://holyspirit.schoolcashonline.com/ Grad fees must be paid in full in order to participate in graduation events.
- Grad Convocation Cap and Gown: Graduates will all receive a cap and tassel that will be theirs to keep. Graduates will also have the option to order a rental gown. The deadline to order a rental gown is Friday, May 14, 2021 through School Cash Online. These may be used for the Convocation or for picture taking with family. A graduate is not required to rent one if he/she is choosing to attend the ceremony in formal wear (ie: a grad dress, traditional dress, suits, etc.) but has the option to wear a convocation gown if he/she would like to. Ultimately, we would like to be as flexible as we can with what graduates elect to wear for the ceremonies but would encourage graduates and parents/ guardians to recognize that this is a formal event.
