Principal's Message



February is a short but busy month at Catholic Central. There is simply so much going on: the start of the second semester of the school year, the continuation of high school athletics, the startup of new athletic seasons, clubs ramping up into high gear, and preparation for the Musical Theater 15 Projectit is a busy time! Also coinciding with February, comes preparations for next years' student course selections. Believe it or not, administration is already hard at work in preparing for the next

school year for the coming fall. Yes, while only half completed the current school year, planning is well underway. This is always a time that is met with a great deal of anticipation by students and parents alike (teachers too for that matter!), as all involved begin to make plans for the coming school year. Most importantly for students and parents, this endeavor signals a time of continued maturation as a student and as a person, and perhaps even begins to coalesce toward a chosen career path or post-secondary direction following high school completion. Whatever the case may be, as someone who is quite involved in student timetabling and in the master timetable myself, I would like to offer a few pointers and suggestions when making course selections with your child/student:

have an open dialogue with your student. As student's mature and start to evaluate their academic strengths and interests, they recognize where their educational passions lie.
 Take the time to talk together as a family about what courses interest them and where they feel they best excel. Make course selections that meet the needs of the student and position them to experience success as they define it. You may even be surprised by your students' course preferences!

- reference our school handbook (it can be located on our website, and a copy is always available in either of our offices). In it you will find detailed information about high school graduation requirements, course offerings and information, and course prerequisite information that is vital to planning toward high school completion. It is a fantastic and sometimes overlooked resource to all
- please consider the prerequisite and course "stranding" structures. CCH administration
 and our teachers put a considerable amount of effort and research into these
 recommended pre-reqs. They are designed to assist students in finding success as it is
 most readily prevalent to them for where they are currently in their educational journey.
 The progressions through the various courses are very nuanced and differ from one
 another, and again, can be found in our student program handbook
- it is not just all about "core courses". Yes the cores (Religious Education, Social, Sciences, English, Math) are significant, but there is so much more to consider. Remember, a minimum of 10 Career and Technology Studies credits are required to graduate (along with others such as CALM and Phys Ed 10). Our staff is among the best you will find at providing unique elective courses that are designed to engage your student and provide learning opportunities to foster their passion for learning and develop key areas of interest in their educational journey. We always have new course offerings and significant course revisions annually!
- feel free to contact the school and ask to speak with an administrator or counselor if you
 have questions or inquiries in regards to how to best plan your student's journey toward
 becoming a high school graduate. We have many years of experience and are happy to
 help you!

Timetabling decisions are not made in a vacuum of course. We offer and extend our information and expertise to students and parents in several forms. For those students incoming from our junior high feeder schools, watch for Mrs. Polec's Grade 9 parent information coming out shortly. 

ST. MICHAEL

This month brings us to a different kind of saint as we turn our attention to the holy archangels. St. Michael is the leader of all angels and of the army of God. This is what the title "Archangel" means, that he is above all the others in rank. St. Michael has four main responsibilities or offices, as we know from scripture and Christian tradition: 1) to fight against Satan, 2) to rescue the souls of the faithful from the Devil, especially at the hour of death, 3) to attend the dying and accompany them to judgment, and 4) to be the champion of God's people; the Israelites under the Old Law, and now the Catholic Church.

Explanation and Hierarchy of the 9 Choirs of Angels

1ST TRIAD - CONTEMPLATE AND ADORE GOD DIRECTLY

SERAPHIM (meaning "the burning ones"). They are attendants at the throne of God. They praise God singing, "Holy Holy Holy is the Lord of Hosts!" - ISAIAH 6:1-7



CHERUBI They conte

CHERUBIM (meaning "the fullness of wisdom"). They contemplate God's providence, and are assigned to protect special places.

- EXODUS 25:18-21; EZEKIEL 10:14; REVELATIONS 4-6

THRONES represent the steadfastness of the love of God. They contemplate God's love and judgment, and they appear as the most unlike the others when revealed.

- EZEKIEL 10:17; COLOSSIANS 1:16; DANIEL 7:9



2ND TRIAD - FULFILL GOD'S PLAN IN THE UNIVERSE



DOMINIONS are lord over the lower choirs and humanity. They take illumination from the higher hierarchies and govern the universe.

- EPHESIANS 1:21; COLOSSIANS 1:16

VIRTUES run the operation of movement in the universe. They are often associated with planets, elements, seasons, and nature. - EPHESIANS 1:21



POWERS assist in governing the natural order. They are warrior angels tasked with fighting the war against the demonic choirs. - EPHESIANS 3:10; 6:12




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3RD TRIAD - INTERACT AND SERVE HUMANITY CLOSELY

PRINCIPALITIES are of the lowest triad, assigned to care and guard communities, kingdoms, states, and parishes. They are associated with transitions in power.






Connections


