PREREQUISITES: A prerequisite is a course that must be completed before the next or higher level course may be taken. Normally a minimum mark of 50% has to be achieved before the following course may be taken, eg. English 10-1 is a prerequisite for English 20-1. A recommended mark of 60% or more in English 10-1 is required for a student to English 20-1. Credits will be withheld in a course for which a student does not have the prerequisite.

GRADE 10 PROGRAM ENTRANCE GUIDELINES

To pre-register in these courses students **must** have the following Grade 9 marks, which will be the average of report card marks at the second reporting period in Grade 9.

PURPOSES OF DIFFERENT COURSE SERIES

In four subject areas – English, Social Studies, Mathematics and Science – these are different course series that are developed for a variety of purposes and have varying degrees of difficulty. The different course series are numbered accordingly.

- Course series numbered 10-1 20-1 30-1 and 31 are designed primarily for students planning entry into university
 or certain programs in colleges and technical schools.
- English and Social Studies numbered <u>10-2 20-2 30-2</u> are designed primarily for students planning entry into certain programs in colleges and technical schools, trade schools, or entry into employment.
- Course series numbered <u>14 24</u> are designed primarily for students planning direct career entry into some areas of employment.
- The Math 10C and Math 10-2 classes are designed for entrance into a variety of university and college programs (which program will dictate which math stream). Math 10-3 is designed primarily for students planning for some college programming and/or fields of employment.
- English 10-4, Social 10-4, Math 10-4 and Science 10-4 is the designated Knowledge and Employability Program.
- Math 30-2 and Science 30 can be used as an admission subject in specified program at universities, and are highly recommended.
- Learning Support is a program for students who require 1:1 assistance because of multiple disabilities.
