



Principal's Message

As we enter the festive month of December, we are invited once again into the sacred season of Advent—a time of preparation, hope, and joyful anticipation. At Catholic Central, Advent offers us the opportunity to pause in the midst of our busy lives, reflect on the promise of Christ's coming, and prepare our hearts to welcome Him anew.

Advent, from the Latin *adventus* meaning "coming," calls us to prepare for two profound moments: the celebration of Christ's birth at Christmas and His promised second coming. Beginning on November 28, at the start of Block 3 classes, our students and staff will journey through the four traditional themes of Advent:



Week 1: Hope – We light the Prophecy Candle, remembering the hopeful promises foretold in Scripture.

Week 2: Peace – The Bethlehem Candle reminds us of the peace Christ brings to a weary world.

Week 3: Joy – With the pink Shepherd's Candle, we celebrate the joy proclaimed to those who first heard the Good News.

Week 4: Love – The Angel's Candle reflects the boundless love God shares with humanity through His Son.

These weeks guide us in strengthening the virtues that shape our faith and ground us in the true meaning of Christmas.

At Catholic Central, our Advent preparations extend beyond prayer and reflection. Alongside our weekly Advent services—led by Students' Council and supported by our classroom teachers—our school embraces acts of charity and compassion. This year, we again support Santa's Anonymous Christmas Hamper Project, The Angel Tree Project, and our sock/toque/gloves Giving Tree. These initiatives encourage our students and families to recognize and respond to the needs within both the Holy Spirit Catholic School Division and the greater Lethbridge community.

December is a lively month at CCH, filled with basketball, curling, and wrestling, as well as the tremendous work happening in our musical production and in clubs such as Robotics, Yearbook, and Athletic Leadership. In the spirit of tradition, I continue to share the origin story of one of our most beloved initiatives: the Santa's Anonymous Christmas Hamper Project.



Many of you will recognize the name of Mr. Wikenheiser (Mr. Wik)—now retired—who first proposed this project after seeing a large-scale version "up north." With the support of then-principal Mr. Mombourquette (now board trustee), he launched a modest initiative of "20–25 families" during the 2000–2001 school year. Along with Mrs. Vill (Villeneuve), he coordinated the project out of Trinity Learning Centre with the help of eight students. After only two years, the team outgrew the space and moved to the CCH Vasey Hall Gym, where the project truly took root in 2003–2004.

Over the years, Santa's Anonymous has been led by many dedicated staff members—including Mr. Wik, Mrs. Vill, Ms. Perron, Mrs. Fetting, Mr. Spiess, Mrs. Gardner, Mrs. Dempsey, Mr. Skretting, Mr. New, and Mrs. Christensen—and has been sustained by countless donors and volunteers. What began as a small outreach has grown into a 20+ year legacy, involving multiple staff facilitators, more than fifty students annually, and generous support from community partners. Schools across the Holy Spirit Division have also contributed through their own fundraisers.

It is humbling to reflect on the impact. Estimated collectively, our community has contributed roughly \$675,000 in-kind, supporting approximately 1650 families with food and Christmas gifts over the years. This year, Catholic Central is committed to supporting 50 families within the division, given the short turnaround time between October 29 (our return to school) and the deadline to have all hampers prepared (December 10).

This is where YOU come in.

If you are able, we invite you to consider donating either:

- a complete hamper (\$300-\$350), or
- any financial amount, large or small.

If financial giving is not possible, spreading the word among your family, friends, and wider community is a tremendous support. For those who prefer to contribute food items, please contact Mr. New for a list of accepted donations.

Every year, I am deeply moved by the generosity and compassion of our CCH community. Thank you for being a part of this mission and for bringing hope, joy, and dignity to families who need it most.

On behalf of all of us at Catholic Central, I wish each of our students and families a blessed Christmas and a joy-filled New Year.

Dear Parents/Guardians of Grade 12 Catholic Central students:

Grad Photographs: Our photographer this year is Lifetouch Canada. There is NO CHARGE to grads to have their picture taken. Pictures are taken on these dates and times:

Grads will have their pictures taken with cap and gown (as provided by Lifetouch at their studio). The following are suggestions for the best photos:

- Look like the "best version" of yourself, which means if grads plan to have hair and makeup done for pictures, make sure you look like you!
- The grad gown is a v-neck, so it is wise to wear either something that is also a v-neck or a shirt with a tie. Do not wear a hoodie or a sweater that adds any sort of bulk to the neckline/ underneath the gown.
- You may also choose to have other pics taken ie: with a grad dress or suit or with "props" like hockey sticks or dance shoes, etc.
- The sessions will be 30 minutes, and we will do formal cap/gown photos as well as casual photos. Graduates may also bring appropriate props to be included in their sitting. (ex. sports equipment, musical instruments, etc). The use of props provided by Lifetouch (roses, diploma scroll) is voluntary, we have implemented safety protocols for sanitizing props or will provide one time use props for each sitting.



Co-Curricular Athletics Update

Our Cougars have had an outstanding and energetic start to the 2025–2026 athletics year, with several teams accomplishing remarkable milestones this fall.

November marks the end of both Volleyball and Football seasons.

In Volleyball, Junior Varsity Boys finished first in the Year-End League Championship. The Junior Varsity Girls fought hard but ended up short in their year-end tournament.



Both our Senior Girls and Senior Boys Volleyball teams had incredible seasons, earning their spots at Zones in Medicine Hat. The SV Boys finished with a perfect win record during the regular season of play and were recognized with the Prairie Sky Conference League Champions Award for the second year in a row. Their hard work and consistent play propelled them to qualify for Provincials in Fort McMurray, where they proudly represented Catholic Central with determination, skill, and sportsmanship. The SV Girls came close to advancing to Provincials as they lost to a strong MHHS team (and defeating Raymond and WCHS). Good news: They were offered the first wildcard spot as they were previously ranked second in the province for 4A schools final rankings; they will accept the wildcard and go into Provincials ranked 5th! We are immensely



proud of the achievements of both these teams and the way they carried themselves throughout the season.


