Catholic Central High School Book Return Policy



Students are asked to return library books that are overdue and textbooks promptly at the end of the Quarter, by April 4. These need to be re-distributed to other students in a guick turnaround.

A Caution Fee of between \$80 and \$140 has been added to your school fees. Should a book not be returned, or returned damaged, the cost will be deducted from this fee. If the caution fee is insufficient, the student will be billed for the balance. All materials will have to be returned in good condition or the fee will be implemented. If all materials are returned, the caution fee will be refunded at the end of the school year. *Materials returned after September 15, 2025 will not be refunded as the book will be determined to have been lost and a new book will have been purchased.*

Note: Please take care of these materials so that we can pass them on to other students in good condition.

GRAD 2025

As we enter into the last full planning month before Graduation Ceremonies 2025, it is important to review what we have done and what is left to do:

- The first grad list has been posted. Students must ensure that they check their graduation status and the name that we have in PowerSchool for them. Should a student require a "name change" (ie: student wants to be called up to the stage as anything other than the name we have PowerSchool), they must fill

out a "Name Change Form" which can be picked up at either office.

- The last fee grad fees have been collected and grad gowns, stoles, and caps with tassels have been ordered. These will arrive a week or so before graduation and will be distributed to graduates on the morning of May 9 on Campus West at the morning rehearsal which will begin at the bell (8:10 am). Please do not be late to this meeting.
- Grad photos are close to being complete. Any grade 12s that missed their sitting at LifeTouch will need to reach out to LifeTouch directly to reschedule. If you need assistance with this, please contact Mrs. Sutter.
- There are many opportunities for graduates to be involved in the events over the course of the weekend both at Graduation Mass and at Convocation. We welcome and encourage students to consider volunteering for these various roles. Once your individual name is put forward, it will be taken to the Staff Graduation Committee for consideration and selections will be made. Mrs. Polec will then contact graduates in mid- April to offer them the role.
 - * Please note, there are some roles that are "selected" by the grad committee like Valedictorian (based on formula for highest academic achievement) and Commentator for Mass (based on formula for second highest academic achievement).
 - ** Second note, as there are limited roles, we will take into consideration our four pillars of faith and service, academics, fine arts, and athletics and an individual's contribution to building community over the past three years at CCH.
- Any suggestions for Grad Songs/ Themes are due by Tuesday, April 1, 2025. The form to submit can be found in the Grad 2025 Google Classroom.
- Grad Statements should have been formally submitted in grade 12 RE 35 classes. If any revisions need to be made, please email them to Mr. Vercillo before Friday, April 4, 2025.





"Do not remember the sins of my youth or my transgressions; according to your steadfast love remember me, for your goodness' sake, O Lord!"

St. Dominic Savio, April 2, 1842 (Feast Day: May 6)

Domenico Savio was born into a large family in rural Italy in 1842, and from a young age was keenly interested in his Christian upbringing, attending Mass and receiving special permission to receive the Eucharist. He was a hard worker at school, and to continue his education at age ten, began walking about five kilometers each way to the school at Castelnuovo. It was here that he would eventually meet St. John Bosco, with whom he then returned to Turin. He resolved during this time to become a saint, and experimented with various penances that he thought would assist with this goal. John Bosco, upon hearing of this, forbade it and recommended that Dominic focus on his studies and duties, doing all to the best of his abilities, which led Dominic to say "I can't do big things but I want everything to be for the glory of God." He continued to work diligently at school, to pray frequently and fervently, and sought to be a good example to his classmates

In the spring of 1857, at the age of 14. Dominic became ill, passing in March, Don Bosco wrote a short biography of Dominic, which led to his increasing popularity despite his young age at death. Due to his heroic virtue, he was canonized in 1954, and until 2017 was the youngest non-martyr saint in the Catholic church. You can learn more about him by watching one of these short videos:

The Apostles' Creed

"the holy catholic Church ... "

The Nicene Creed uses here the words 'I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. These four marks are actually quite significant, and perhaps help us to understand this section more clearly. They are calls to action that animate our lives, not just a passive mention of the Church. Our word Church comes from the Greek word kyriakon, derived from Kyrios - 'something belonging to the Lord' or ekklesia - 'an assembly of people called forth.' After Vatican II, we often refer to the Church as the 'People of God." That's all of us!

Hope

- . One we desire unity with one another, with our Catholic brethren, and with our Christian family. (CCC 813-818, 820, 866)
- . Holy we believe that the Church is the place where we find holiness - in the sacraments, in our liturgy, and so on. While the Church is not perfect, it is holy. God is the source of holiness; the Spirit unites us in holiness; Christ is the perfect model of holiness.(CCC 823-829, 867)



As we seek to become Pilgrims of Hope this year, let us continue to contemplate the Creed, and how our proclamation of the Creed unites us to one another and to all Christians through time and space

The Jubilee Prayer: English | French | Spanish

Inside the overall Jubilee year, there are a variety of specific celebrations that are occurring on the calendar. It is exciting this month that we have two celebrations that are specifically pertinent in our schools. From April 25-27, there will be a jubilee of teenagers that will culminate with the canonization of Blessed Carlo Acutis. This will be followed on April 28-29 with the jubilee of people with disabilities. Given these two celebrations, it might be a good time this month to review Christus Vivit - Pope Francis' apostolic exhortation to and about young people, which was the response of the Holy Father to the 2018 Synod on "Young People, the Faith, and Vocational Discernment" which laid a new foundation for the Catholic Church's current work with youth and young adults. We have embedded this into this current faith plan, so some of it will likely sound familiar to you! In the upcoming Easter season, we might for instance revisit the message at the outset, which are words of great encouragement to us:

Christ is alive! He is our hope, and in a wonderful way he brings youth to our world, and everything he touches becomes young, new, full of life. The very first words, then, that I would like to say to every young Christian are these; Christ is alive and he wants you to be alive! He is in you, he is with you and he never abandons you. However far you may wander, he is always there, the Risen One. He calls you and he waits for you to return to him and start over again. When you feel you are growing old out of sorrow, resentment or fear, doubt or failure, he will always be there to restore your strength and your hope



Let us pray that the use of the new technologies will not replace human relationships, will respect the dignity of the person, and will help us face the crises of our times.

Gospel Reading: John 8:1-11

Gospel Reading: John 20:1-9

He is Risen! Alleluia!!!

When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered His head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. —John 20:6-8

The Lord is risen! It is the miracle of all miracles! Jesus has overcome death! The disciples couldn't understand at first what had happened because no one had ever risen from the dead before, and we might not be able to understand it either. But the resurrection is a promise that our life doesn't end in death. There is something more waiting for us on the other side. Jesus has bought us eternal life! What an awesome God who always loves us! Thank you for such a gift, Lord! We praise You!



Gospel Reading: John 20:19-31

"On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." — John 20:19

A greeting of peace was not the first thing the disciples expected to hear from Jesus. "Where were you when I needed you?" "Why did you all run away?" "I'm disappointed in you." Those were the sort of things the disciples might have expected to hear. Instead, Jesus came in love. He wished them peace. He knew they were afraid and ashamed. But he proved that his death was all about forgiveness, even of their sins. It is the same for us. No matter what we have done, no matter how terrible we may think it is, Jesus comes to us with forgiveness, peace, and great love.

How do you think you would have felt if you were one of the disciples when Jesus appeared to them? What are some things I can do to accept Jesus' love?
