

From the Director's Chair Braden Dalton

Mamma Mia! Here I go again! My, my, how can I resist... making this the opening remark of this note from your loyal director? Welcome back to the Knights of Columbus Eggplant Theatre! Does it show again? My, my, just how much [we]'ve missed you? Now, Knowing Me, Knowing You, you have accepted the mission of enjoying another production inside these esteemed purple walls, and we hope to live up to the expectation! Synopsis

Songs such as "Dancing Queen," "Super Trouper," and "Take a Chance on Me" punctuate the story, adding depth to the characters' journeys and highlighting their emotional highs and lows. The story culminates in a joyous celebration of love and acceptance, with unexpected twists and heartfelt revelations.






Lochlan MacWilliam - Pepper


